



#### News from the Principal's Desk:

Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

On Wednesday, grade 3 through 6 students welcomed Sergeant Holst and Officer Loynd ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children) liaison to Erving Elementary School. Our guests presented information to students in each classroom on the topic of Internet safety. My letter to parents in early February addressed the topic of Internet safety, and why we should closely monitor our children's activities whenever they are online. In the past few months there has been an increase in the number of social media sites aimed particularly at the younger generation. We are concerned that our children can be the innocent victims of cyberspace activity, lured into communicating with persons who are unknown to them. We will continue to provide a safe environment for our children, educating them about the potential dangers of the digital world. Erving Elementary School will be partnering with the ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children) liaison to present additional information to parents and guardians about how they can manage their children's use of a digital platform. We encourage you to talk with your son or daughter about the potential danger of the Internet. Ask if they have a social media account. You may want to review his or her profile to ensure that no personal and identifiable information has been posted. We also encourage you to establish rules and guidelines to ensure the safety of your child while on the Internet.


### Curricular Updates - Or, can you believe it's March already?

Clay has been a great favorite lately as students mastered techniques such as building a pinch pot and learning how to score, while also building up their hand strength with all the pinching and pounding and pushing. Other things we've been up to lately:

- **PRESCHOOL** has been exploring art materials outside; using snow paint, pushing sticks into clay, and building animal homes with their 6th grade buddies.
- **KINDERGARTEN** enjoyed a sewing unit, explored ways to attach cardboard to build a sculpture and made mosaics to think about how little shapes fit inside bigger ones.
- FIRST GRADE created paintings of their hopes for this world, and are now working on collaborative murals that challenges them to work together.


