### News from the Principal's Desk:

Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

Tap tap tap echoes from down the hall. After a few seconds a drum roll, soon to be accompanied by the sound of horns, clarinets, flutes, saxophones and a variety of bells and whistles. Our band this year is growing in number. 43 students in total from grades 4 through 6. This sudden surge in interest generates a demand for instruments that students can use on a daily basis. We are working things out for the moment, however it is difficult to have to share an instrument, particularly if it is your turn to practice and the person you are sharing with has left the instrument at their home ③. School Committee has given us the go ahead to plan for an increase in equipment. In the meantime, if you are aware of anybody who has an instrument resting quietly in a box in the corner of a room, please ask them if they would consider donating their instrument to the school. I know that Ms. B.C. would be extremely grateful, and will take great care of their prized possession.

Erving Elementary School administered PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) assessments in grades 3-6, for the 2015-2016 school year. PARCC is a different measuring stick than MCAS. The assessment includes challenging questions designed to measure critical-thinking, writing and multi-step problem solving. You recently received a copy of your child's detailed score report, while educators have received summary data of students' scores. Most schools are assigned a level from 1-5. EES remains a level 2 school. The lowest performing schools across the state are assigned 4-5.

PARCC is only one indicator of a child's academic performance. There are many ways that we evaluate a student's academic progress during the school year. Formative assessments, observations, work samples, projects, conferences and unit assessments are continually being done to ensure that all students receive the support and enrichment that they may need. PARCC does not report each child's unique skill set and diverse strengths. Artistic, scientific, kinesthetic and athletic talents are certainly not included in the numbers and labels listed. EES values all the components that each child brings to the community. We understand that though the test does give us some useful information around how to reflect on instruction, curriculum and meeting the needs of our students, it is not the complete and singular measure of your child's or our school's performance.

As you may know, Massachusetts has evaluated PARCC, and the state Board of Elementary and Secondary Education has decided to replace MCAS and PARCC with the nextgeneration MCAS. This test will be given for the first time in the spring of 2017 and will use items from both PARCC and MCAS, along with items developed specifically for the Massachusetts test. Students in grade 4 are required to take a computer test, while grades 3, 5, and 6 will take a paper test. As we have done with previous assessments, we will use the spring 2016 data to reflect on our students' areas of strength and on areas where they may need additional support.
