Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

I wanted to share some of the work that EES staff has undertaken during our Wednesday afternoon professional development time. As previously mentioned, Erving Elementary School staff have been working with Chip Wood over the course of this past year. We will be continuing our work with Chip for the next 2 years. This critical work is tied to building adult community, which 'builds on thoughtful and actionable answers to important questions we can ask when we set out to improve education: What would it be like if the entire adult community of schools acted from their own identity and integrity on behalf of students? What are the best conditions we can create collectively to make it possible for everyone to bring their best selves to the enterprise of school?' (Parker J. Palmer). Yesterday, EES staff created guidelines that will help support and inspire our work together as we transform our school. In order to do this successfully, we have to first experience personal transformation. Over the past year, I have witnessed our staff go through this personal transformation, as we reflected on, and examined our work together. We are building trust amongst every person in our community. Relational trust and a successful adult community are not easily created, particularly in today's environment. I believe that we have taken some monumental steps towards creating the ideal environment at Erving Elementary School. Our next steps are to make sure that we bring our guidelines to life. I am confident that we can take the steps necessary to ensure our students are successful in learning and in life.

Erving Elementary School Guidelines:

Trust and appreciate that we can learn from our diversity

Be present and mindful and accept that teaching is imperfect and unpredictable

No idea is a bad idea – all staff have a voice that's valuable, and are integral to student success

Remain open to all ideas

Ms. Haggerty and I had a lovely time watching our younger students get ready to go play in the snow. We were in preschool the other day and had the pleasure of watching 3 and 4 year-old students get ready to venture out into the forest. My expectations were completely turned upside down! They have become so independent, getting their gear together, putting on snow pants, boots, gloves, coats and hats. Each one of them took turns to come to Ms. Haggerty, Mrs. Parse or myself, to have their gear checked, just to make sure they had their boots on the right foot, coats and pants zipped up, and everything tucked in. Kudos to Mrs. Parse for making this activity one of learning, as students sang merrily along to the Christmas tunes, lining up in order of the first sounds of their name. Every student was listening attentively, eager to get out into the cold 3.

I hope you are wrapped up for the coming cold weather. Please enjoy this last weekend before the winter break. I look forward to seeing you all at the Winter Concert and Cookie Exchange next Friday.

Hello from After School,


