
When: Friday, January 12, 2018, 8:30-9:30am. This will be the first of what we hope to be a monthly gathering (possibly the second Friday of the month).

50 Point Club Inductees

These Readers Rock!

Students celebrated students in the Well, on Wednesday, as the 5^{th} and 6^{th} grade held the induction ceremony for Accelerated Reader's (AR) prestigious 50-point club.

Accelerated Reader is a software program students use to take a brief quiz on books they've read. The range of point values goes from a fraction of one point to above 20 for very large books. A typical 5th grade level book has a value between 4-7 points. Mrs. Flaherty and Mr. Burnett have challenged their students to set a goal of reaching 100 AR points by the end of the year.

On average, this term, students have read 10 books each to make it into the 50 point club. They have really taken on the challenge, making individual goals above and beyond 100 points. Many even pushed themselves on Monday and Tuesday of this week to make it to the next level. Sixth-grade students have taken 287 AR tests, earned 2058 points and get this..... read over 14,390,000 words!!!

Congratulations to all those who have entered the 50 point club and beyond! To those that are working on entering the club, keep reading, reading!
