### Don't forget the sunscreen!

Now that the nicer weather seems to be here to stay and the sun is shining more days

It is not reasonable to think that teachers will be able to adequately apply sunscreen to 15-20 kids before going outside and still have time to do other important classroom things. Please consider applying sunscreen to your child as part of their before-school, morning routine.

I have included a letter to grade 4, 5, and 6 parents and guardians in connection with the perils of the Internet. Whilst my letter is addressed to our older grades, please be aware that some of our younger students are also at risk whenever they are left alone to explore the Internet. On June 15th I will be joining members of the Internet Safety Task Force who will be presenting information to students in grades 4, 5, and 6. During our meeting with students I will outline the consequences they face should their cyber world actions interrupt and/or impact the education of students at Erving Elementary School. Please take some time to monitor your child's online account(s) and block sites that are clearly influencing our younger students in a negative manner. Thank you for reinforcing this message.

Effective June 1, our school cafeteria will be following USDA guidelines for all 3 year-old children. The USDA has established certain food items that cannot be served to 3 year-old children. We have passed this information along to all of the parents whose child is impacted by this new set of guidelines. Effective September 1, 2018, Erving Elementary School will provide a separate menu for preschool students. This menu will take into account these new guidelines. We are happy to set up a meeting when parents can come along and contribute their ideas for this new menu. Please contact me should you wish to be involved in the planning of the menu.

Dear Parents and Guardians of grade 4, 5 and 6 students,

This is a critical time for our older students due to the recent surge in online social media platforms being targeted to younger students. Online safety is an important component of overall student safety, especially now during the summer months when children spend more time using computers, laptops, tablets, and smart phones to go on the Internet. The Internet as a medium promotes communication and socialization, but often without restraint. Children don't realize that there are real-life consequences for poor online choices. It doesn't occur to them that what they post online can be copied, saved, and forwarded to others and remain long after the original has been deleted. They feel anonymous when they create screen names and online personas that can be totally different than who they are in real life. They can fall in with a bad crowd, communicate the wrong things, get to know the wrong people, and endanger themselves and those around them.

With this in mind, it is a good opportunity to open the door to a greater conversation we should be having with our children about social media and their "digital footprint." I am taking the opportunity to meet with our students on June 15<sup>th</sup> to talk about our duty of care and how we want to ensure we provide all students with a positive, safe, and nurturing environment, in which they can learn, develop and socialize. It is important for every student to have access to technology, free from potential targeting.

On behalf of our students and staff, I am enlisting your support and co-operation. We encourage you to talk with your son or daughter about the potential danger of the Internet. Ask if they have a social media account. You may want to review his or her profile to ensure that no personal and identifiable information has been posted. We also encourage you to establish rules and guidelines to ensure the safety of your child while on the Internet. Some Web sites offer parental or family guidance for Internet safety; for example, SafeKids.com, located online at <a href="http://www.safekids.com">http://www.safekids.com</a>. I have included a couple of other links that you may find of use.

Good Afternoon from After School,






barrels locally from Jeff Budine at the Greenfield Farmer's Exchange.
