Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

The School Committee meets next Tuesday night at 7pm. There are a few items on the agenda, including a math presentation by a team of Erving Elementary School educators, who want to thank the School Committee, Board of Selectmen, and FinCom members, for their continued support of the math program at EES. Our journey over the past 3 years has been exciting, enlightening, and inspiring. We are working together, thinking about the teaching and learning of mathematics. We are using our time together to explore mathematics and share ideas

about how to reach all students. Our goal is to build confident, competent and engaged students of mathematics (www.erving.com). Also on the agenda will be a vote for the FY19 School Budget, and School Calendar. The School Council will present data from the recent March Vacation Survey that went out to all parents/guardians and EES staff.

Erving Elementary School was recently awarded a \$500 grant by the EOS Foundation in recognition of our work in providing all students with a free breakfast and lunch. Our Free Breakfast and Lunch Program (Community Eligibility Provision) levels the field for all students. C.E.P. means that students across the country no longer have to claim free meals due to low income/status. As far as the meals go, we are reaching out to students to get their feedback on our menus. In the near future, students will be given the opportunity to design healthy, cost efficient breakfasts and lunches. This opportunity connects our academic work in school to real-life situations that students can more easily understand. I will be curious to taste the delicious meals our students design @.

We will still have the professional development curriculum day on March 23rd. Our weather has not worked out as we had hoped, with the potential for another storm next Wednesday. The same can be said for the weather overseas. My family in Ireland and England keep getting the remnants of the storms, snow, driving rain, and bitter cold. Students in sixth-grade have been having some hair-raising adventures (literally) as they recently learned about static electricity.


Why does rubbing a balloon across your head cause your hair to stand up?

Dear Summer Park Families,

The Erving Recreation Commission and Summer Park Staff would like to thank you for your part in another successful season! We hope your child had a memorable experience and will look forward to our many events throughout the year.

As the season winds down, we would like to inform you of upcoming policy changes to next year's program, that were approved at our August 2nd meeting.

- The rate for in town residents will increase to \$15 per day/\$75 per week. The rate for out of town residents will increase to \$30 per day/\$150 per week.
- Sign Ups for in town residents will be from April 1, 2018 through May 13, 2018. No child will be turned away if they are signed up by May 13, 2018. As of May 14, 2018 registration for out of town residents and any remaining Erving residents will be on a first come, first serve basis ending when the roster is full or on June 15th.
- Only <u>completed registrations</u> will be accepted. This includes the application, recent photograph, proof of physical and deposit. If the registration is not completed, your child will not be added to the roster until you have all of your information in.
- Ages allowed in the Summer Park program are as follows: Five years old and entering Kindergarten through any age entering Sixth Grade.
- Daily Drop off for Summer Park Attendees is from 8:30 to 9:00 am. If you miss this time, your child will not be able to attend Summer Park that day. Children MUST be signed in and out by an adult, no curb side drop offs are permitted.
