Dear Erving Elementary School Community,

I have been working with superintendents from other rural school districts to educate and advocate for our small rural schools through the Massachusetts Rural Schools Coalition. The information-contained below explains the public forum that will take place on March 12th. I would like to invite you to attend.

STATE SENATOR HINDS HOSTING STATE EDUCATION OFFICIALS IN SHELBURNE FALLS ON MARCH 12

This is a public forum on Fiscal conditions challenging rural schools.

Making sure the rural school districts in our region have the funding they need to thrive will be the topic of a forum on March 12th from 6:00-7:30pm in Shelburne Falls, State Senator Adam G. Hinds (D-Pittsfield) announced today. Hinds, who serves as Senate co-chair of the Legislative Rural Caucus, is convening this policy conversation at his alma mater, Mohawk Trail Regional School, to highlight the fiscal conditions and challenges faced by rural school districts in western Massachusetts and statewide. State education leaders from the Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE) will be in attendance to

provide an overview of a recent report filed with the General Court on this topic and answer questions. Hinds' colleague State Representative Stephen Kulik (D- Worthington), House co-chair of the Rural Caucus and vice-chairman of the House Committee on Ways & Means is also confirmed to attend. Hinds sponsored and secured this reporting mandate in the FY18 state budget, specifically directing DESE to conduct a feasibility study relative to establishing a formula for aid to be distributed to rural school districts. Pursuant to the legislation, DESE filed the report in January with the Joint Committee on Ways & Means, the Joint Committee on Education and the Commonwealth's Rural Policy Advisory Commission. DESE Acting Commissioner Jeffrey Wulfson and Director of School Finance Rob O'Donnell are in western Mass, at Hinds' invitation on March 12th to discuss recommendations and potential strategies to support rural school districts in the coming fiscal year. Hinds believes this conversation is timely as legislators are now preparing to deliberate FY19 state budget spending recommendations. Municipal officials, school superintendents, school committee members and members of the public from across the region are encouraged to attend. Falls Cable, the public access television channel for Buckland and Shelburne, will tape and televise the event. During the forum Mohawk Superintendent Michael Buoniconti will outline fiscal hardships facing rural school districts. DESE officials will report on important data, findings and recommendations from the report and Senator Hinds and Representative Kulik will facilitate an open discussion between officials and audience members.

Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

On Thursday we had a visit from the Massachusetts State and Erving Police Departments. Our Fire Department team was also in attendance. The teams were onsite to initiate a lockdown drill during our lunch and recess time. This time of day presents everybody with a plethora of potential scenarios to manage and monitor. Students were actively engaged in their own worlds, chatting with friends, running across the playground, playing ball games, along with a general buzz of excitement in the air. The police and fire teams moved into discreet positions and the lockdown went into effect. Within a couple of seconds the scene changed dramatically, the student's attention was drawn to the lockdown announcement, follow up whistles, staff giving instructions, while ushering students to previously designated safe locations. We have protocols in place for students who are inside the building, and students who are outside at recess. Following the lockdown, State and Erving Police Chiefs met with all of the students and staff to provide feedback, and solicit audience questions. We were very happy with the feedback. Considering the complexity of the lockdown, students and staff did a wonderful job. They were quiet, listened to staff, followed directions, and moved to their locations immediately. The teams watched from a distance as the students and staff handled everything that was expected of them. I am proud of the manner in which our students and staff handle themselves in stressful situations. I hope that we will never be called on to use this particular set of skills, however the experience and learning is valuable. My thanks to the staff for the great care they take with our children. Thank you to Chief Blair, Sergeant Holst, Fire Department - Ryan Betters, and Brandon Breault, and State Police Officers.


