Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

A special thank you to all mothers. Have a beautiful weekend, filled with love, tenderness, and gratitude for all that you sacrifice and do for our world.

I would like to provide some clarification with regard to our cafeteria food service. Our goal is to introduce more local, fresh produce into our menu selection, while remaining fiscally accountable to the residents of Erving. You may have read in local newspapers about surrounding school districts that have for many years struggled to balance their school cafeteria budgets. Some schools have run into deficits that amount to over \$200,000. Although we are a small school, we fall within the same classification as all other schools, when it comes to ordering food from the successful bid winner (Thurston Foods), who supplies the majority of schools within Franklin and Hampshire counties. Back in November, I notified the School Committee that we have been experiencing a high number of product returns with our current supplier (Thurston Foods). The returns are due to damaged and unsatisfactory produce. Donna LaClaire has done a great job communicating our concerns with their Food Distribution Manager. Due to a limited response, we have started to look at alternative plans for sourcing produce, including reaching out to other school districts. The bottom line is that local sourcing will cost us more money. Just how much money, comes down to the volume and frequency of orders, including product availability from the local producers. I am available to chat should you have suggestions and contacts that you feel will help guide our research and decisions. I will keep you posted on any major developments over the course of the remaining weeks of school and summer.

Congratulations to Stephanie Barry who was presented with an Outstanding School Employee Award by Horace Mann Associates. This special award was the result of a nomination by one of her students (Jaiden). We are extremely proud of the work that Steph does with all of her students, and her support of the incredible work that is carried out every single day by the staff at Erving Elementary School. We are blessed with amazing educators who give tirelessly to the children of Erving. On behalf of the residents and community of Erving, I congratulate all of the staff at EES. It is an honor to come to school every day and share in the outstanding work that each one of you do.

The Department of Early Education and Care recently endorsed a new TV series called 1, 2, 3, Grow! This series provides access to information about healthy development in children. At Erving Elementary School, we will continue to focus our work on how we can support every child and family, especially around areas such as wellness, social, and emotional growth. 

1, 2, 3 Grow! Child Development Program for Families

"1, 2, 3 Grow!," a new multilingual and multicultural TV series that provides families with equal access to information about healthy development in children, is now available. "1, 2, 3 Grow!," is available in eight (8) languages airing on cable stations across Massachusetts starting in May 2018.

Each of the shows includes a local pediatrician and program host from the same culture who speaks the language of the particular audience: English, Spanish, Portuguese, Mandarin, Haitian Creole, Arabic and Vietnamese, as well as a show that focuses on African-American needs. The shows will also provide contact information for a local family specialist who can help families obtain more translated resources on child development and access to other services. There are several ways to view the "1, 2, 3, Grow!" shows:

- •Within the city of Boston, the shows will air on Boston Neighborhood Network Television (BNN-TV) every Wednesday night at 7:00 pm from May 2, 2018 through August 15, 2018 with reruns of the episodes during that time period.






