

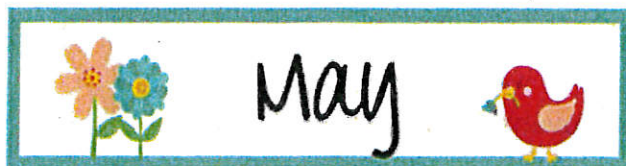

Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

Our thanks to members of the Erving Fire Department (Ryan Betters and Brandon Breault) who are coming into the school to work with students on specific trainings around fire safety. The programs are Preschool – Stop, Drop & Roll, Kindergarten – Crawl Low Under Smoke, and First Grade – Get Outside, Stay Outside. When you get a moment, ask your child to demonstrate the techniques they have learned over the course of their training. It was great watching some of the preschool students demonstrate their Stop, Drop, and Roll technique while waiting in the front lobby the other afternoon.

Our MCAS testing window completed this week and I have to say that our students handled the transition from paper and pencil test to a computer test with incredible ease. Thank you to all of our staff, especially Michelle Fisher and Tom Smith for preparing our students for this smooth transition. We expect it will be some time before the MCAS results are released to schools and the public. I will keep you posted on developments.

Mr. Blatchley returned to fire off the remaining water rockets with the group. We were able to entertain the walking club

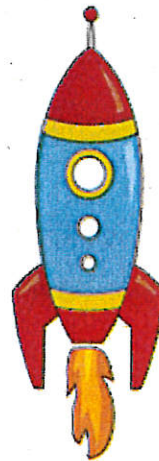
with our activities. Hunter's rocket went up the furthest with Lissandra's coming in a strong second place. What fun we had.

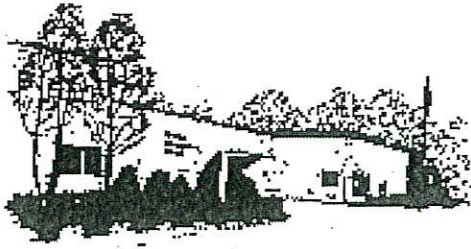

They will not be allowed to play on the structures or blacktop due to limited adult supervision in these areas.
