

News from the Principal's Desk

Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

Walk the hallways at Erving Elementary School and you will clearly see and feel why traditions are so critical to the success of our school. On St. Patrick's Day, our whole school had the opportunity to join in what has quickly become a worldwide tradition. Celebrating the Green! Everywhere you looked there seemed to be a person donned in green regalia. Whether you have Irish in your blood, or just wanted to have a good time with friends, the atmosphere at EES was filled with laughter, singing, and a bucket filled of good wishes. We had a lot of fun during All-School Sing with Miss B.C. leading us in a few Irish tunes. I



promised the students I would share the image of our sign-a-long with a few schools from my parent's hometown of Galway.

As technology moves towards the future, Erving Elementary School (EES) has been granted the privilege of having Google Apps For Education (GAFE). Most schools have already switched to GAFE or are in the process of implementing GAFE from Grades K through 12. GAFE is a free, web-based office suite of applications including: word processing, spreadsheet, presentation, draw, forms, and calendar programs. To prepare for the school-wide launch of GAFE in the 2016-2017 school year, our current Grade 5 and Grade 6 students will pilot the program this spring.

GAFE is a more efficient way for students to store their work and be able to share and collaborate with teachers and other students. Documents are stored safely and securely on Google servers. Students are able to access their work using any Mac, PC, or portable tablet device. All student work is saved on the fly so students do not have to worry about saving, or the risk of losing work if they forget to save or have their computer crash. GAFE maintains continuous data backups and are safe from any hard drive crashes or loss of data.

Access to the student GAFE accounts are tightly managed by the school. Each student is provided with an @erving.com email as their account login. GAFE is a closed system so students are not allowed to send and receive any emails or any other communications outside of the school system. Our management of these accounts complies with CIPA (Children's Internet Protection Act) and the Erving Elementary School Acceptable Use Policy.

We ask all parents/guardians of our 5th and 6th grade have their child login to their GAFE account and give you a tour of the apps and the work they have done so far. EES teachers and staff have been using GAFE for a year now as part of our teaching collaboration and communication.




March 14th is National Pi Day. Pi is the 16th letter of the Greek alphabet. It looks like this: π . It is used to find the area and perimeter of circles. It represents a constant - the ratio between circumference of a circle and its diameter. Pi is an irrational number, meaning it goes on and on forever and never ends. It is typically known as the value of 3.14. We can look at months in words, like March 14, 2016, or we can look at it in an abbreviated form, like 3/14/16. So, the connection to making March 14th Pi Day is because Pi's value is 3.14. It was made an official day by the U.S. Congress in 2009.

The sixth-grade celebrated Pi day after working on the concepts of circumference (perimeter) and area of circles. We celebrated this illustrious day by reading about the adventures of Sir Cumference and his son, Radius. We enjoyed many types of pies (thank you parents and guardians!!), and played Pie Face. The fifth graders were our special guests for the festivities. Arianna was our Pie Face champion, Levin was the fifth-grade Pie Face champion, and Mr. Burnett sliced Mrs. DeSorgher to take the teacher championship.
