Dramamine and Field Trips

This is just a quick note to clarify the regulations for use of Dramamine and other over-the-counter (OTC) motion sickness medications for field trips. Like all other OTC medications, before it can be given, the school must have on file a current, signed order from the primary care physician stating what medication is to be given, the dosage, why it is needed (a diagnosis) and when it is to be given. To avoid this extra work, it is recommended that children be given motion sickness medication **before** coming to school in the morning. 4th Grade National Braille Press

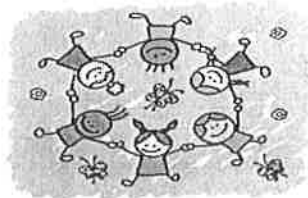
Fourth grade will continue to collect donations through May 10th for the National Braille Press. The donation box is located in the front lobby on the office counter.
