Things didn't quite go their way for the end of this year, so one way we thought we could honor them was to have these graduate signs created as a reminder of students who are ending their journey with us.

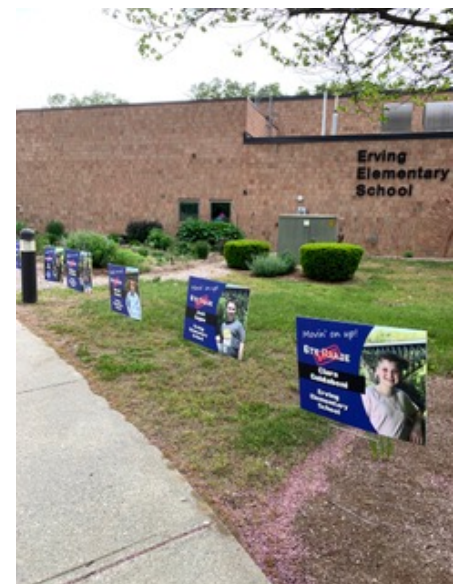
