Dear Families and Friends of Erving Elementary School,

#### Movement Matters ... with Jess Galvin

After what seemed like a LONG time, it was great to be back in person with students. While we enjoyed our time online trying new HIIT exercises and new interactive games, there's nothing like seeing the student's faces, hearing their voices and laughter, and seeing them make progress and succeed in various areas.

In M&E, we've been trying some new activities in preschool to work on various movements. We've been including some Kidz Bop music in there while they are moving their bodies! The preschool students have also become quite skilled on the scooter boards here and are now beating me in races! Kudos to them!

Kindergarten has had the opportunity to begin learning how to play floor hockey. Because we are social distancing, they are learning to rely on passing to one another to move the ball down the floor. It's a work in progress, but progress nonetheless. Ms. Gagne and I have been having fun playing with them as well!

For the students I only see online, we have continued to add to our workouts. I've found several videos that are interactive and seem to be a big hit with students. I've been using these as dynamic warm ups for us. It seems to get the students motivated for what is to come. These are all on my site (located on the school website) if any parents would like to have their children show them what they are all about.

Upper grades are continuing to play some classic games but modified to fit out circumstances. This week, we also added in some full body Rock, Paper, Scissors and short in person HIIT workouts to warm us up. They can show you what the Rock, Paper, Scissors game looks like.

If there are ever times when you feel your child needs to get up and move, please don't hesitate to go to my site and let them choose a workout, dance, or interactive game. It's a great way to burn some energy and get some exercise!















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#### MATH MATTERS... with Allison Graichen

The following is a short excerpt from an article by Colleen Uscianowski and Herbert P. Ginsburg from the Teachers College at Columbia University sharing how picture books can help to foster mathematical understandings in children.

Storybooks provide a rich opportunity to build not only literacy skills, but also math understanding. Books with math concepts woven into the pictures and storylines can promote children's mathematical thinking and introduce foundational math concepts such as numbers, shapes, patterns, and measurement. Asking questions and making observations about the math found in picture books can support children's curiosity and enjoyment of math.

For example, Quack and Count by Keith Baker is about seven ducklings quacking, sliding, and flying in marshland. Throughout the beautifully illustrated story, the seven ducklings form different groups that can be added and always make seven. While reading, children can explore counting and addition as they practice counting a group of ducks that are not always neatly in a row and in fact may be hard to see—a challenging but enjoyable task.

The most important rule to keep in mind when selecting and reading a math picture book is to enjoy the stories and enjoy the children enjoying the stories! Read often, smile, and laugh. Ask questions. Build mathematical understandings together!

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



#### Can we order only only the suggested books?

Not at all! You can search for ANY book—including chapter books, graphic novels, classics, activity books, etc. You can also search for puzzles, games, toys: It's a great alternative to Amazon!

#### Do we have to pick up the books at school?

Nope! Your order will be shipped directly to the address you choose at checkout. Have more than one reader in mind? You just need to create a separate order.

#### Can I have my order wrapped?

Yes! \$2 for the first item gift wrapped and \$1.50 per additional item.

#### How does my order benefit the school?

We at High Five Books work directly with Erving staff to distribute a percentage of our total store profit from this fair right back to the school. Shopping small helps us all!

#### Is it possible for my recipient to return a book if they have it already?

Yep! You'd work with our distributor Bookshop to do so. And we can help walk you through that.

# Virtual Book Fair Staff FAQs

#### How is a Bookshop book fair different than a traditional one?

For one, it's totally online! Caretakers browse and order virtually, and books are shipped directly to families' homes from our warehouse. No standing in line, no school pick ups!

Unlike publisher-sponsored book fairs, readers can choose from a MUCH wider variety of titles via our virtual book fairs. And rather than earning credits just for a specific publisher to use toward future purchases, participating schools have the choice of receiving store credit from High Five Books *or* cash. Those funds stay local!

#### What is High Five Books?

We're a new kids' bookstore in Florence, MA, aimed at providing progressive, social justice-minded picture books, early readers, chapter books, graphic novels, and more. We LOVE collaborating with local schools and organizations around collection development, and we're always happy to help devise book lists or make bulk orders.

#### What is Bookshop?

Bookshop.org is a new e-commerce site that launched in February 2020, created to help independent bookstores better compete for online sales. Over 400 indie bookstores are participating and to date over 11 million dollars has been raised to support them. We at High Five Books use Bookshop to bring our favorite book collections to readers around the Pioneer Valley—and across the country!

#### Can I create a class wish list?

Yes, via a small workaround: Each staff member can create their own Bookshop.org user account and add books to their own wishlist. We'll then link to each teacher/ staff member's wishlist from the main page of the school book fair landing page. Just send us your wishlist link to be added!
