Reference: Please submit one letter of recommendation from a teacher or professor.

Criteria: Each of the two scholarship selection committees will carefully review all applications and will choose one recipient. Consideration will be given to:

- quality of the essay
- academic success and the applicant's commitment to his/her continuing education
- dedication to school and community

The ETA scholarship will be awarded after the documented successful completion of your first semester for use in your second term.

The P.I.E.E. scholarship will be awarded at Awards Night ceremonies for graduation to be used for first semester expenses.

Please submit your completed application to the address above by May 20th, 2023.





TRAINER:

Jetta Bernier is Executive Director of MassKids, a statewide, citizen-based child advocacy nonprofit, where she directs the **Enough Abuse Campaign** - a community mobilization and citizen education initiative on child sexual abuse developed under a 5-year grant from the federal CDC and now adopted in 8 states.

Using the research-informed and highly evaluated Enough Abuse Campaign curricula, Jetta will provide an **overview of child sexual abuse** and **specific policies and practices** that can be implemented to keep children and youth safe. She will discuss **the nature and scope** of child sexual abuse and how to prevent it in families and communities; how sexual abuse negatively impacts children's long-term health and mental health, social-emotional learning, and academic achievement, and legal obligations to report suspected or disclosed cases. **Free resources** will be provided, including *Straight Talk About Child Sexual Abuse: A Prevention Guide for Parents*, the Pledge to Prevent campaign for action, child safety posters for schools and youth organizations, and more.
